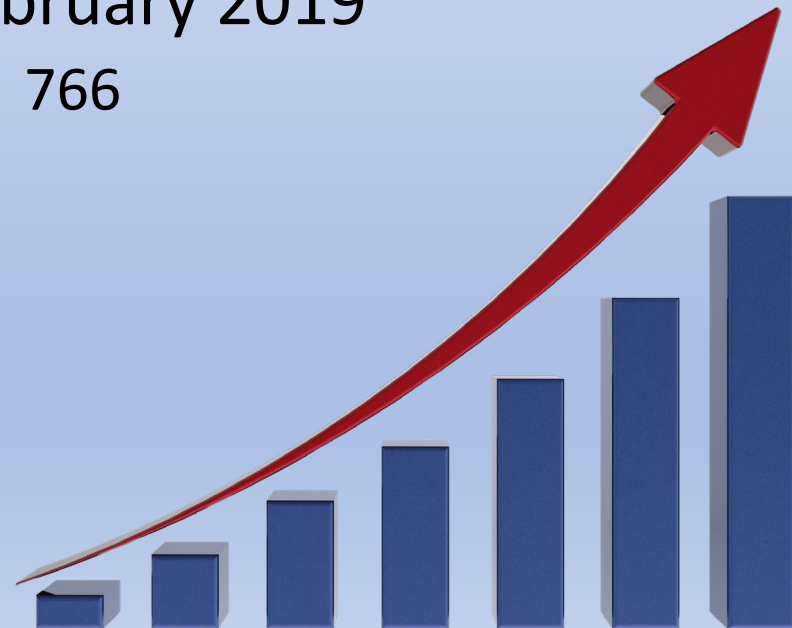
Clients

Exceptional Parents Unlimited (EPU)

- Grant cap - 225
- 168 referrals as of 02/20/2020
- No contact or declined program – 30 clients
- 138 active referrals
- 102 families started/completed program
- POS increase – 37 clients (36%)

Fiscal Year 2018/2019 Disparity Data

Autism Diagnosis:

- 11,331
- 29.5% no POS = 3,345
- 2.5% decrease in disparity

Primary language Spanish:

- 7,604
- 22.4% no POS = 1,700
- 1.8% decrease in disparity

Hispanic ethnicity:

- 15,791
- 25.3% no POS = 4,003
- 1.1% decrease in disparity

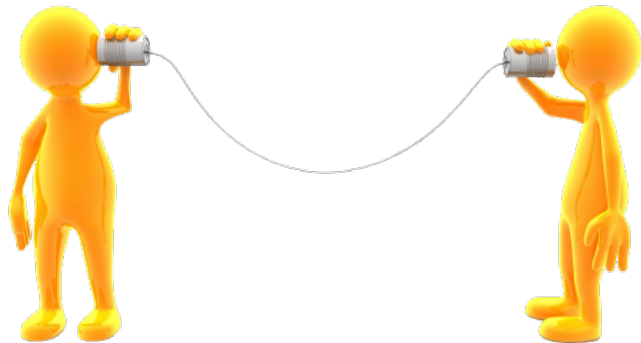
