FY2023-2024 Project #7: Development of an Inclusive Survey for Deaf plus IRC consumers

GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION: TBD

CONTRACT AWARD AMOUNT: Startup funding UP TO \$300,000

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: Funding to collaborate with multiple regional centers (IRC, RCOC, NLARC & ELARC) to assist in creating a more inclusive survey which could potentially be used statewide to identify service options for RC consumers within the Deaf and Hard of Hearing (D/HH) and Deaf Plus population. Applicants will utilize a certified interpreter team (Tri Ling/CDI/CART) to hold eight (8) 2-hour focus groups with Regional Center consumers, gather and analyze data, and create an inclusive survey process. In addition, the awardee will also meet with some individuals in their residence, or a neutral place of their choosing should a group setting not be preferred. The purpose of this service is to get inclusive statistics for the Deaf plus community, as the NCI survey has not been successful for these individuals. Funding will also provide focus group attendees with a gift card incentive for IRC consumers and their support staff to attend a session. The focal point will be on meeting the needs of IRC's Deaf plus community.

Applicants/Entity submitting proposal must have the following qualifications:

- Entity to be owned by an individual that is part of the Deaf/Hard of Hearing Community(preferred)
- Completion of Self-Advocacy Training or Person-Centered Planning
- Education/Training in American Sign Language and Deaf Culture
- The vendor must have licensed individual(s) or master's degree graduates with a focus on creating and conducting surveys or analyzing data and statistics from polls or questionnaires
- An employee surveyor must possess a bachelor's degree in any human services field like social
 work, psychology, sociology, education or special education, chemical dependence
 administration, rehabilitation counseling, criminal justice, and other relevant human services
 degrees
- A bachelor's degree can be substituted with two to three years' work experience subject to the review and approval of a vendoring regional center
- An employee surveyor must be fluent in ASL and have knowledge and work experience relating to Deaf Plus culture
- All surveyors must meet the additional qualifications listed below

- i. Must have at least one year experience in working with persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities
- ii. Experience working with Deaf or HOH individuals with developmental disabilities is preferred but not required
 - iii. Experience conducting surveys, research and or analyzing data
- iv. Demonstrate familiarity with one or more standardized research survey's used widely to assess Regional Center experiences (e.g.,NCI)
 - Any Current Regional Center Vendored Service Providers:
- i. Current vendorization(s) must be in compliance with proper insurance(s), business licenses and other professional licenses pertaining to vendorization or repayment of any funds
- ii. Current vendorization(s) must not be on a Plan of Correction, Corrective Action Plan or have any substantiated Health and Safety risks that have been identified by assigned QA liaison

FY2023-2024 Project #8 & #10: Enhanced Behavioral Support Home for Adults

GEOGRAPHIC LOCATION: Hemet

CONTRACT AWARD AMOUNT: Startup funding UP TO \$132,500

SERVICE DESCRIPTION: The Enhanced Behavioral Support Home (EBSH) is a residential facility certified by the Department of Developmental Services and licensed by the Department of Social Services. IRC is requesting a service provider to take over operations of a currently open and occupied EBSH residential facility in Hemet, CA. This home serves adults who may have individuals with forensic involvement, behavioral challenges, possible substance abuse histories and dual diagnosis. Some individuals may be transitioning from Porterville Developmental Center - Secure Treatment Program (PDC-STP).

Applicants must have the following qualifications (per Title 17 Section 59060):

- An Administrator Must:
 - Have a minimum of two years prior experience providing direct care or supervision to individuals with developmental disabilities and be one of the following:
 - A Registered Behavior Technician
 - A licensed Psychiatric Technician
 - A qualified Behavior Modification Professional (as defined in Title 17 Section 59050 (v))
- Applicant/Administrator must attend IRC's New Residential Service Provider Orientation.
 - If you do not have a current NRSPO certificate, you will be required to attend an orientation within 3 months of being awarded.
- The applicant may be requested to employ/contract with a Board-Certified Behavioral Analyst (BCBA) to provide on-going consulting hours. BCBA must have experience supporting individuals

- with developmental disabilities, mental health disorders and meet the requirements outlined in the California Code of Regulations, Title 17, Chapter 3, Subchapter 2, Article 3, and Section 54342(a)(11).
- IRC's best practice requires that the applicant must have a minimum of two years' experience providing direct care or supervision in a Specialized Residential Facility or above.
- For current EBSH service providers, you must be in good standing with IRC's Quality Assurance
 Unit, IRC's Audit Team and DDS and current on all lease payments with the Housing Developer
 Organization (HDO).

The EBSH exceeds the minimum requirements of a Specialized Residential Facility (SRF) by providing enhanced support, staffing, and supervision as defined in Section 4684.80 of the Welfare and Institutions Code. The EBSH will have a maximum capacity of four (4) individuals, all of whom must have a qualifying Regional Center diagnosis. Individuals targeted for this home will need intensive support and services due to forensic involvement, severe psychiatric, emotional, and behavioral challenges.
